Basically a good, solid paper. David Nokes not mentioned.

Spelling and grammar errors. Just facts, no ideas. Off topic often.

LUPUTIU

Good demonstration at point E. But the rest is most of the time off topic.

NICHITA Narcisa

Almost everything is off topic. Confuses parts of books (Gulliver). Factual errors.

Good language, but ignorance of the facts.

NICOARA Claudia

Too vague.

Spell

- he tyies (à tries)
- english (à English)

MOGA Ancuta

Wrong premises. Illogical ramblings (point C).

GRAMMAR

• al this letters (à these)

OROS camelia

Groundless speculations. Off topic. Wrong facts.

Grammar

• more easier (à more easily)

POP loana

Good, compact, to the point. Appropriate critical language. Knowledge of the facts. Very well.

POP Claudia

You are the only one that got right the Island of the Magicians!

Grammar

- she fell (à she felt) (a simtit)
- more easier (à more easily)

POP Daniela

Grammar

• he didn't saw (à did not see)

POP Monica (an 3)

Simplistic language. Absence of key critical concepts. No mention of Bakhtin.

STEF Ramona (3)

Wrong part of Gulliver. Off topic, speculative.

SZOPKO Talida

Off topic. Wrong guesswork...

TEREMTUS

Several confusions of books and author (point B, C)

TOPAN

Nice work! Good knowledge of both facts and critical notions!

TRAISTA Cristina

Yes, very complete treatment of "realism in Robinson"

Good mastering of key concepts.

TRIF Aurelia

Off topic or confused (mistook Tom Jones for Jonathan Wild).

TARA Mircea

Microscopic writing that is very hard to read...
