- + Good biblio and references
- Many awkward, badly written sentences
- You lost some of the URL's (web addresses)

LEXIC

• Invented words: vid = vacuum

GRAMMAR

- Big grammar troubles!
- Irregular verbs: putted (=put), gived (=given)

BRÅDEANU Andrada

+ Good English

- + Good argumentation (especially point 5, "Should the narrator be considered identical with the author?")
- + Well mastered narratological notions
- What a pity you skipped some points (#3, Synechdoche), or was too meagre on others (#10, Genette)

CHIMSAC Ancuta

- Huge confusions in narratological terminology !
- Many statements that make no sense at all.

GRAMMAR

- 3rd person verbs in the singular: Narrator don't (=doesn't)
- missing article ("the"): [The] Narratee is not ... [The] Matrix is a LEXIC
 - adjective instead of noun: *speak the true (=truth)*
- plural instead of singular: a children (=a child)
- metter (=meter)
- formed with 6 lines (=consisting of 6 lines)

HAIDU Raluca Larisa

- Contorted English

SPELLING

- extenthals (=essentials) !!!
- witch (=which). -repeated many many times. Note that witch means vrăjitoare, and which is care
- *storys* (*=stories*)
- syllabels (=syllables)

GRAMMAR

• no use of the genitive. You say the character mind, instead of the character's mind.

HAPCA Heana

- Terribly terribly broken English. You should start seriously learning English, or else you will never graduate from this univesity!
- Total ignorance of the notions we studied.
- Invented instances (narrator implied)
- "Romanitions", invented words: eveniments (=events)

KERAN Tatia

- Simplistic.

GRAMMAR

• Absence of article *the* in many many situations.

VLAD Mari**ş**ca

– Many confusions of terms. Ignorance of narratolgical premise.

Grammar

- authors had a border that they never cross (=crossed)
- double marking of the past tense: they didn't informed (=they didn't inform)
- 3rd person S ommited: *he decide (=decides)*

SPELLING

- pentamiter (=pentameter)
- they new (=knew)

Lexic

- scientific people (=scientists)
- confusion of noun (*critic*) with verb (*criticize*). The narrator critics (=criticizes)
- confusion of *faith* (=credin**ță**) with *fate* (=destin). *He decide the faith of the characters* (=*decides... fate..*)

PETROVAN Romana

- + Well argued, especially points #5 ("Should the narrator be considered identical with the author") and #7 (Metalepsis)
- Some points are inproperly defined though.

POP Heana

- TERRIBLE English grammar!
- You ignore the most basic notions of grammar

Grammar

- incredibly incorrect construction of the negative: he don't be (2 times!)
 (=he isn't)
- lack of grammatical concord: the author are...

POP Liliana

- Huge confusions of narratological terms.
- Sheer nonsense throughout!

SOFRONICIU Oana

- You are unable to write one logical sentence!
- All is sheer nonsense!

• 3rd person S lacking
